

Directions to Widow Fletcher's Tavern:

Coming from the south: Take I-95 north to Hampton, NH, Exit 2 and follow directions provided below from Hampton Exit.

Coming from the north: Take I-95 south to Hampton, NH, Exit 2 and follow directions provided below from Hampton Exit.

From Hampton Exit (Rte 101, Exeter/Hampton):

Immediately after going through tollbooth you will come to a fork. Take left branch to Rte 101 east to Hampton/Hampton Beach.

Once on Rte 101, stay on right and take first exit to Rte 27 Exeter/Hampton (approx ½ mile after getting on Rte 101).

Exit ramp loops around to the right. At the top of the hill (T-intersection) take a right towards Hampton. This is Rte 27.

Take Rte 27 to set of traffic lights (Hampton Center/Rte 1), approx 1 and ½ miles. Take a right (south) on to Rte 1 (Lafayette Rd).

Widow Fletcher's Tavern is down Rte 1 approximately a ¼ mile on the left.

AH 100M, TR4A, XKE REBUILD CD AVAILABLE

Many of you will remember Peter Davis and his daily driver, a 4A Surrey Top, who was an NET member from the '80s until moving to NJ and finally to retirement in eastern Tennessee. Peter had a devastating fire in his basement caused by a 100w bulb inspection light igniting gas vapor from one of the vehicles - Peter escaped, the house remained intact, but the 4A and the beautifully restored 100M sustained major damage.

Peter cautions that ONLY fluorescent tube trouble lights be used to avoid this danger. There are also wireless, rechargeable LED trouble lights that are equally as safe and less awkward, but they emit less light.

After extensive cleanup and purchase of an array of tools all of us would be envious of, Peter began the second frame-ups for the Triumph and the Healey, which are the subject of close to a 2 hr CD of progress to this point. Peter is a top-notch mechanic and body craftsman, and his typical British wit and candor are a plus.
